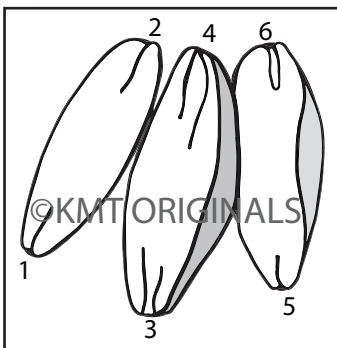

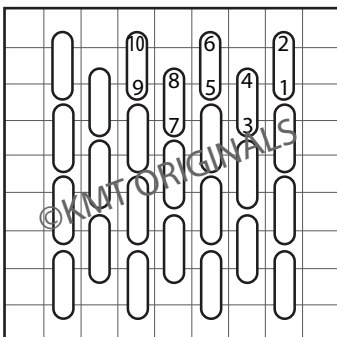
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Stitch Away Stress Week 2021 “Let’s Go Outside” Part 2



RIBBON PETALS

Knot one end of the ribbon to anchor on the back of canvas and slowly draw ribbon to front. Place a finger beneath the ribbon and gently fuss it into a pleasing shape as you draw it down. Petals will form as either convex or concave and cannot be completely controlled. A mixture of the two gives a nice look. The extra wide petals may require a second stitch to fill. (We began by stitching the petals in basketweave, then worked River Silks Ribbon over the top.)



OVERLAID BRICK

The flower center is worked in Brick Stitch using *Rainbow Gallery Petite Very Velvet*. (Use regular size *Very Velvet* on 13/14 mesh.) The matte appearance is perfect for centers of daisies, cone flowers, and others. We added long stitches of bright *Rainbow Gallery Silk Lame’* over the velvet to bring it to life.

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
